SEMESTER 2 PARENT NOMINATIONS FOR EXTENSION PROGRAM

As a means to strengthen our identification procedures to ensure appropriate placement of Gifted and Talented Students into the Extension Program, parent nominations will now be considered for students in Years 1-6 to participate throughout Semester Two. The checklist attached: Things My Child Has Done devised by Professor Micheal Sayler is an effective tool in assisting parents to determine their child's suitability to engage in an extension program. Student capacity to grasp concepts at a faster rate; find, solve and act on problems more readily and manipulate abstract ideas and make connections to an advanced degree are indicators that your child may be a suitable candidate for the program.

If your child is currently participating in the program or has previously been involved in recent years there is no need to resubmit the checklist.

The Extension Program constantly evolves in terms of the focus according to the academic strengths and interests of each cohort so that the opportunities can be maximised as much as possible for all identified students. It is important to note *that not all gifted students* will participate in the program *all of the time*.

Sessions may target one or a combination of the following: Mathematics, English, areas of personal interest in various disciplines eg Science.

Once parent nominations have been received, consultation will take place with class teachers to determine the discipline area and intended content and skills for each year level. Some of the current classes may continue throughout the next semester depending on the number of nominations received.

If you would like to nominate your child to participate in the Extension Program please complete the nomination form and return to Ms Day by Friday June 28. Hard copies of the checklist can be obtained by emailing <u>julie.day@det.nsw.edu.au</u> You will be notified in writing of the outcome of your nomination early Term Three.
