

CELEBRATING NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK IN PRESCHOOL ARABANA













We have a very enthusiastic Green Team with lots of great ideas for our community. This year the students have divided themselves into 3 subcommittees who are working towards our school goal of reducing waste and working more sustainably at Rozelle PS.

We now have:

- Nude Food/Waste Warriors
- · Energy Warriors
- Garden Warriors

Each team has a starting plan with different areas of focus.

Nude Food/Waste Warriors are currently working on posters and ideas to remind the community about bringing "Nude Food" lunches to school. We are going to have another school wide challenge and all the Green Team members will be collecting data each day during a 2 week period. The class who has the least amount of waste will be awarded the "Tree Trophy". We will be looking at lunch waste and classroom red bin waste. The winning class will be the caretakers of the "Tree Trophy" in their classroom for the 2 week duration until the next class is awarded for their waste reduction efforts.



Energy Warriors As part of the Green Team member role, students are energy warriors who are monitoring power usage in the classrooms. Students are helping to remind teachers to have lights off when the rooms are not in use, switching off devices and using power saving settings.

As a long term goal, the senior students on the Green Team will be working with a teacher to complete a Power Audit in Term 3 (with a Water Audit on the cards for the future)

Garden Warriors This group is passionate about revamping and caring for the gardens behind the current Year 4 classrooms. Kindergarten (with Year 5 buddies) and Mini OSCH Club have already weeded and planted some veggies and are looking into composting and worm farm options that can be maintained hygienically at school.

PRESCHOOL ENROLMENTS for 2020

Applications for enrolment into the preschool program have now opened. All the necessary information and application forms are available on the school website at https://rozelle-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/ or from the school office. Children are eligible for enrolment in preschool classes from the beginning of the school year if they turn four years of age before July 31 of that year. Applications close at 3:00pm on Friday 28 June 2019.

There is no priority for the order in which enrolments are received by the office. The Preschool Placement panel, consisting of the Principal, the President of the P & C and one of our preschool teachers, considers all applications in accordance with the priorities of the Department of Education and Communities' Preschool Enrolment Policy and the Rozelle Public School Preschool Enrolment and Fee Policy.
